#### 21. INDEX TO ARCHIVAL CASE LAW

Judicial records are a rich source for law historians, as well as for economic, social, cultural and political historians. Unfortunately, historians of Israel and Mandate Palestine are hampered because there's no index of unpublished judicial decisions held by the Israel State Archives. As a result, these resources go largely unused.

The Berg Institute has embarked on a project to create the index, but due to changes in the Israel State Archive, the pilot stage is taking longer than expected. It should be completed soon.

#### 22. PRIZE FOR BEST LEGAL HISTORY ARTICLE

This year's annual conference of the Israel Law and History Association marked the inaugural Prize for Outstanding Legal History Article published by a member of the Association. The winning article – chosen by a committee chaired by TAU Prof. Menachem Mautner – was "There Wasn't a Righteous Person Among them: The Gray Zone of Collaboration in the Israeli Courtroom," by TAU PhD candidate Rivka Brot, published in *Jewish Honor Courts: Revenge, Retribution, and Reconciliation in Europe and Israel after the Holocaust*, Gabriel Finder and Laura Jockusch, eds.
