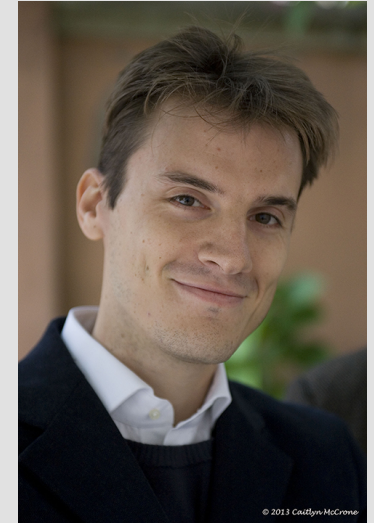


# Transitions to and From Democracy: What Role for Constitutional Courts?

## Francesco Biagi

Transition processes on the one hand, and constitutional justice, on the other, are topics that, each in its specific domain, have been the subject of numerous in-depth studies. This seminar will bring together these two fields of research by discussing the role that constitutional courts play in the transitions to and from democracy. What are the main factors that facilitate and hinder the action of constitutional courts? Is a “centralized” system of constitutional adjudication more effective than a “decentralized” model? Do constitutional courts enjoy more or less legitimacy during transition processes? To what extent can constitutional courts reduce the high degree of uncertainty that characterizes every transition process? This seminar will try to answer these and other questions by relying on case studies from Europe and the Arab world.
