### Academic Information

#### *Degrees*

Exchange students are only able to enroll in J.D. classes. Some exchange students may be allowed to count credits taken as part of the exchange towards an LL.M. at Notre Dame degree pursued after the exchange period. If a student is interested in the LL.M. at Notre Dame degree, they should contact Dr. Felicia Caponigri, Director of International and Graduate Programs.

Students interested in participating in the exchange program for the fall semester may be able to study in London and enroll in Notre Dame Law School's London Law Program. Students should indicate this choice as part of their application.

Nomination deadline	Feb. 15th or 6 months prior to beginning of exchange period, whichever is earlier
Duration of study	4 months
