

- E-mail Address (valid and contactable e-mail address)
- Term of Exchange Spring 2019 (1 term) or Spring 2019 & Fall 2019 (2 terms = 1 year)
- Student's Major at Home University
- Coordinators are required to prescribe the SMU School that best fits the student's degree programme in his/her home university.

Upon nomination, students will be informed of the application procedures. Late applications will not be entertained.

Online application (Students):

For enrolment in Spring Term: 30 September 2018

Academic Calendar



All one-credit courses at SMU last for an entire term (13 weeks), with the rest (0.5-credit courses) held over a period of half a term or for the full term. The period of exchange is usually one or two terms. Classes run intensively from Week 1 onwards.

Spring Term/Term 2 = 7 January to 28 April 2019

Recess week = 25 February to 3 March 2019

Exam week = 15 to 26 April 2019

Fall Term/Term 1 = 19 August 2019 to 8 December 2019

Recess week = 7 October 2019 to 13 October 2019 Exam week = 25 November 2019 to 6 December 2019

Grading



SMU adopts a 4-point grading system. The following grade notations are used in calculating the Grade Point Average (GPA), which is the quotient of total grade points divided by total course units attempted:

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Entry Requirements



Students must have completed at least two semesters of undergraduate studies and must continue to be registered as degree-seeking students at their home universities throughout their intended duration of exchange at SMU.

As the medium of instruction at SMU is English (except for language courses), students must be proficient in the English language in order to benefit from their studies at SMU. Students from non-English speaking countries or institutions must fulfil at least one of the following:

- a. TOEFL score of at least:
 - i. 550 for the paper-based test; or
 - ii. 213 for the computer-based test; or
 - iii. 79 for the internet-based test
- b. IELTS score of at least 6.5; or
- c. any other English Language qualifications as determined by SMU.

Academic Information



The minimum course load of 2 SMU credits per semester remains unchanged. On an exceptional basis, students may register for a course load of 5 SMU credits per semester, with a formal request from the home university.

Each full-credit course at SMU carries a weightage of 1 credit. It consists of 3 contact hours per week over a period of 13 teaching weeks (i.e. 39 contact hours). A half-credit course has a total of 21 contact hours per term.

For each course, there will either be:

- 1 session of 3 hours per week; or
- 2 sessions of 1 ½ hours each per week.

All full-credit courses run for one academic term. There are 15 weeks in each term, consisting of 13 weeks of seminars (39 hours of classes), one recess week and one examination week. Recess week is usually used by local students for group work and/or preparation for assignments. International Exchange Students will have to participate in group work / projects.

All dates of exams are displayed in the course catalogue and are fixed.

(Dates are set to take into account Seasonal/Religious holidays in Singapore and will not be changed to accommodate holidays from other countries)

Assessments can include but not limited to:

- Class Participation: Missing classes will affect your grades and the grades of group members.
- Individual Project: Reports, Homework, Essays, etc.
- **Group Project**: Students will be involved in group work with local SMU students and attendance may affect their performance. Some group work preparations may take place during the recess week. When enrolling for courses, International Exchange Students need to consider this.
- Presentation (Individual/Group): Most courses require either an individual presentation and/or a group presentation.
- Mid-term test: Some courses may include a mid-term test. It will be conducted during week 7 or 9.
- Final examination: Not all courses have a final examination.

Example:

- (a) Class participation: 20%(b) Individual project: 15%
- (c) Group project: 10% presentation, 25% report (d) Final examination (two hours, closed book): 30%

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Only undergraduate programmes/schools (Accountancy, Business, Economics, Information Systems, Law, Social Sciences) are open to exchange students. Students who are nominated via school-level exchange agreements may be restricted to courses offered by the school. A list of courses available for exchange students will be sent to applicants about two weeks before course registration.

Students enrol for courses via a bidding system. There is no guarantee on course availability and enrolment of the student's preferred courses. Hence, it is strongly advised that students exercise flexibility and to seek prior approval from their home university to enrol in alternative courses.

Postgraduate courses are not open to exchange students. All incoming exchange students can only take undergraduate courses.

Pre-requisites

Some courses require students to fulfil certain pre-requisites before reading the course. The pre-requisites are listed in the online course catalogue. If students have done similar pre-requisites in their home university, they are advised to check with the SMU course instructors on the fulfilment of these pre-requisites.

Students are encouraged to prepare a course outline (in English) of the courses they have taken that meets the pre-requisites, for review by the SMU course instructor up. Reviews may be done up till the first week of the academic term.

Students may look up the course instructors from the Class Sections and contact them directly for enquiry on course pre-requisites. The list of SMU instructors are available via the <u>Faculty Directory</u> at the SMU website.

Class Attendance



All students are required to attend all classes. In all courses, the instructor will determine the acceptable level of attendance. If, in the opinion of the instructor, the student has been absent excessively, he /she may be given a grade F. If the student receives a grade F due to absence during the term, he / she shall be expelled immediately from that respective course for which the F grade was given. It is important for students to note that class participation is an important aspect and component of the University's assessment system.

To participate actively in classes, physical presence is required (unless otherwise stated by the course instructor). Missing classes mean forfeiting opportunities to contribute constructively to discussions and activities. Unless granted an 'Excused Absence', absenteeism will erode the class participation grade. Should any student expect himself / herself to be absent with a valid reason for an extended period of time (2 weeks or longer), he / she shall be required to inform the course instructor in advance to seek consent. If any student skips classes for an extended period (3 weeks or longer), and attempts by the instructor / School to contact him / her via official means (e.g. email, phone) are unsuccessful, he / she shall then be liable to have his / her student registration status terminated. Accordingly, the student shall be withdrawn from the university.

In any circumstances, students who are unable to attend classes should nonetheless act responsibly and notify their respective instructor and peers of their absence from class / project discussions.

It is a university policy for students to attend classes when term starts. Late arrivals are NOT accepted.

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Health and Accident Insurance



It is compulsory for all incoming exchange students to purchase the *Student Health and Accident Insurance* as recommended by SMU. Cost for this insurance is included as part of the miscellaneous fees. (https://www.smu.edu.sg/campus-life/student-services/international-exchange-health-insurance)

As the *Student Health and Accident Insurance* does not cover overseas travel, students shall be required to purchase additional overseas travel insurance for any travel to and out of Singapore during their exchange term.

Additionally, SMU has engaged the services of International SOS to provide 24-hour travel assistance for students. International SOS provides updated information, travel alerts and assistance regarding security and medical issues happening worldwide. Students are strongly advised to download the International SOS Mobile Assistance App on their mobile devices upon enrolment.

Welcome Orientation



Orientation for international exchange students is scheduled from 2 – 4 January 2019.

Attendance is **compulsory**. Only students with valid reasons notified to SMU IO through the home university's exchange coordinator, may be considered for exemption.

Latest arrival date: 1 January 2019

Early arrival is compulsory:

- To facilitate the processing of Student's Pass and collection of the SMU student ID card.
- To complete the medical health examination ONLY for students on 1-YEAR exchange programme. (https://matriculation.smu.edu.sg/2018/pre-enrolment-medical-examination-international-student)

Estimated Expenses



Quality of lifestyle in Singapore are amongst the best, offering one of the highest living standards in Asia with state-of-the-art facilities for education, retail, dining, sports and recreation.

Exchange students may expect to spend approximately S\$7500 – S\$9000 per term (including housing rental).

Below is the breakdown of the estimated monthly expenses for a student's stay in Singapore. However, kindly note that the expenses do not include tuition fees and overseas travel.

Estimated monthly expenses

- Accommodation: S\$900 S\$1800 (apartment-sharing for three to four persons)
- Food: S\$300 S\$500
- Local transportation: S\$100 S\$150
- Telecommunications: From S\$30 (varies with usage and packages subscribed)
- Books and stationery: S\$30 S\$100
- Personal expenses: S\$100 S\$300

Students shall be required to pay a compulsory SMU Miscellaneous Fee of approximately S\$220-S\$250 per term.

The fee covers health services, SMU health & accident insurance, IT & Library services, student activities and sports facilities fees.

The SMU Miscellaneous Fee is NON-REFUNDABLE.

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Visa and Study Permits



Exchange students are required to apply for a student visa (Student's Pass) prior to arrival in Singapore.

The SMU International Office shall first facilitate the application of the student visa on your student's behalf before his / her arrival. Please refer to the Singapore Immigration and Checkpoints Authority's website (http://www.ica.gov.sg/) for more information about visas and immigration matters.

Upon arrival in Singapore, your student will be granted a Social Visit Pass stamp in his / her passport or Disembarkation / Embarkation Card. This allows your student to stay for at least 30 days in Singapore. Before the expiry of the Social Visit Pass, your student must collect his / her student visa. More details shall be provided at a later stage to guide the students on the next steps of the visa application process.

Internships and Working Part-Time Are Not Permitted While On Exchange

Internships and career services offered by SMU Dato' Kho Hui Meng Career Centre (e.g. career talks) are **NOT** open to exchange students. Exchange students are **NOT** allowed to undertake any internships nor work in Singapore, regardless paid or unpaid. Accommodation



Exchange students have the option to rent private apartments for their accommodation, through housing agents or the open market. Alternative accommodation includes hostels in the SMU vicinity.

Dwell Student Living Student Hostel

Dwell is a student hostel within walking distance from SMU. It offers single, twin, triple, and quadruple-share rooms. Bathrooms and toilets are shared facilities for all residents on the same floor. The hostel is surrounded by a variety of budget-friendly eateries as well as a supermarket. It is also well-connected by public transportation. More details can be found via their <u>website</u>.

Yo:Ha @ Pearl's Hill

SMU has leased several apartments on two floors from a private hostel operator at a complex known as Yo:Ha @ Pearl's Hill. More information on Yo:Ha @ Pearl's Hill can be found *here*. The apartments at Yo:Ha @ Pearl's Hill offer either twin or quad sharing. Each apartment also has a living area, kitchen, and bathroom. Location and campus facilities

Code of Student Conduct

The University desires and expects its students to exercise initiative and responsibility. Students should conduct themselves responsibly in all their pursuits. Responsible behavior includes the following:
